Numismatica Ars Classica is proud to present the Count Felice Restelli della Fratta collection which constitutes without doubt the largest group of coins of Rhodes and Malta ever assembled. The late Count Restelli della Fratta, long serving officer of the Italian Royal Navy, was awarded two military decorations 'sul campo' and two crosses 'al merito di guerra'. He was made Knight of Grace and Devotion and Minister Plenipotentiary of the Sovereign Military Order of St John of Jerusalem, Rhodes and of Malta; Knight of Grace of the SMO Costantiniano of Saint George; Cavaliere Gran Croce dell'Ordine Equestre del Santo Sepolcro di Gerusalemme; Cavaliere di Gran Croce dell'Ordine di Sant'Agata; Cavaliere di Gran Croce dell'Ordine di San Sava; Cavaliere della Corona d'Italia. An internationally recognized numismatist and collector of

Maltese coins, Count Restelli was an authority on the history of coinage in Malta. After the war he joined and expanded the family business, one of the leading Italian textile companies in the umbrella sector. He developed a keen interest as a collector by building first a collection of coins of the Republic of San Marino, then a very important medal collection of the Stato Pontificio, and finally a very fine collection of decorations of Military Orders. The collection was put together with great enthusiasm and considerable financial effort during a period of nearly thirty years, the first purchases dating back to the mid-sixties. He devoted many years and most of his spare time to the study of the coins of the Maltese Order and created one of the most important collections of coins of the Maltese Order worldwide. The collection became the basis for "The Coinage of the Knights in Malta" a new publication on Maltese coins, published by Count Restelli together with J.C. Sammut in 1977, which is now recognized as the standard work on the subject for collectors and numismatic dealers.

Amongst the highlights of the collection, we would like to draw your attention to the following pieces:

Two rare ducati of Philippe Villiers de l'Isle Adam, struck in Rhodes, lots 38 and 39.

An extremely rare zecchino of Pietrino del Ponte, lot 41.

A very rare, dated ducato of Juan de Homedes, lot 42.

An extremely rare 4 tari of Claude de la Sengle, lot 57.

A rare 4 tari of Hugues Loubenx de Verdala, lot 136.

An equally rare 4 tari of Martin Garzes, lot 151.

The exceedingly rare zecchino of Luis Mendes de Vasconcelos, lot 169.

The attractive 2 zecchini portrait piece of Jean-Paul Lascaris, lot 191.

The extremely rare 4 zecchini 1695 of Adrien de Wignacourt, lot 234.

Three different 4 zecchini of Ramon Perellos y Roccaful, lots 240-242

A truly sensational 12 zecchini 1725 of Antonio Manuel de Vilhena. It is the only known specimen and the largest gold coin ever struck in Malta, lot 256.

Ten 4 zecchini and six double zecchini of the same Grand Master, lots 257-272.

An extremely rare example of a 30 tari silver ingot, issued by the French during the blockade of Malta in 1799-1800, lot 431.

A selection of historical medals relating to the Order of St. John, lots 432-475.

Finally, two very interesting hand written documents of Malta, dated 1660 and 1763.

Count Restelli took years to gather this truly outstanding collection. Its destiny is its dispersion, like so many other collections. May these coins and medals find their way into the hands of new owners, whose love and fascination equals that of the collector Restelli.

Ho avuto la fortuna di conoscere il conte Felice Restelli nei primi anni Settanta quando, giovanissimo e sconosciuto, iniziavo la mia carriera di numismatico professionista.

Il Conte era un personaggio mitico, stimato e ammirato nel mondo della numismatica; potete quindi facilmente immaginare quanto fossi emozionato quando un comune amico mi fece fare la sua conoscenza.

Il Conte mostrò subito una grande simpatia e disponibilità nei miei confronti e mi invitò anche nella sua splendida villa di San Marino.

Sfortunatamente non potei godere a lungo della sua presenza perché di lì a poco scomparve lasciando un vuoto incolmabile non solo nel mondo della numismatica.

Era un personaggio eclettico, con interessi i più disparati. Non posso certo parlarvi dell'industriale o del Cavaliere di Malta, ma mi soffermerò sul numismatico.

Pur essendo l'incarnazione del collezionista gentiluomo di vecchio stampo, aveva una visione assolutamente moderna del modo di collezionare monete: non si fossilizzava su una collezione per tutta la vita. Per lui il piacere di collezionare si esplicava nell'acquisire sempre nuove straordinarie monete per le sue collezioni e, nel momento in cui queste ultime divenivano talmente complete da impedirgli o comunque rendergli particolarmente difficoltose nuove acquisizioni, il Conte ne iniziava una nuova.

Le monete di Malta furono solo l'ultima delle tante collezioni da lui intraprese. Voglio qui ricordare la collezione delle monete Papali e la quella delle decorazioni, che diventarono talmente importanti da essere considerate fra le più rilevanti mai realizzate.

Il suo libro sulle monete di Malta, pubblicato insieme a J.C. Sammut, a distanza di molti anni rimane l'indiscusso testo di riferimento per queste monete che e' valso al Conte Restelli un posto di assoluto rilievo nella numismatica, oltre che come collezionista anche come uomo di scienza.

Nowhere in the old or the more recent literature is there an explanation for the letters MA, appearing on the obverse of this Pinto 20 scudi. Engraver or mint master initials are very unusual on Maltese coins. Azzopardi (pages 202 and 203) gives us a listing of all the commissioners (mint masters) of Malta between 1609 and 1798. As the initials MA do not correspond with any of the commissioner's names of the period, we are of the opinion that MA can only represent the initials of an engraver.





While this may not be the most attractive coin in the Restelli collection, it is certainly one of the rarest. Azzopardi only knows of five ingots of this type. The last time one of these appeared on the market was in 1954 at an auction in Paris, where it realized the considerable sum of 100'000 FF.

Soon after the capture of Malta by the French in June 1798, the British began their blockade of the island. The commander of the French forces, Claude-Henri Belgrand de Vaubois was asked several times to surrender; eventually the blockade was so complete that the garrison and the population were dying of starvation at the rate of a hundred people a day. De Vaubois surrendered and the British took over the control of the island in September 1800. Although the treaty of Campoformio stipulated that Malta be evacuated, it remained in British hands until independence in 1964.

The obsidional ingots, issued by the French authorities in 1799 and 1800, were the last coins to be actually struck in Malta and constitute one of the most interesting chapters of Maltese numismatics. A single gold ingot is known to exist, dated 1799; some very rare silver pieces are undated (1799) others carry the date 1800, also equally rare.

The French mint master Joseph Lebrun has left important notes relating to the mintage of the ingots. Of the several thousands of silver ingots issued, only a handful have survived.

Dangerous forgeries of this coin exist such as the specimen illustrated in Pagani, easily recognised by the obvious differences in the dates and letters.




